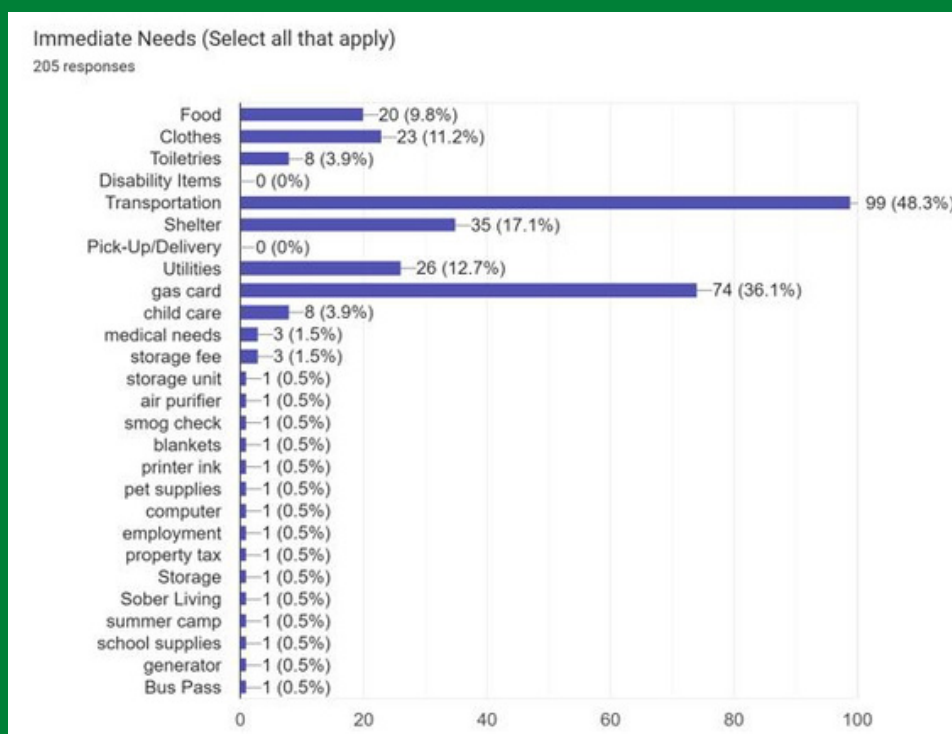
We began our new year cycle of the Dignity Community grant with 7 partners including: St Benedict's Episcopal Church, Morro Bay Lions, Transitions Mental Health Association, City of Morro Bay, Alliance of Pharmaceutical Access, Wilshire Community Services, and Dignity Health Community Outreach.

We are all working together to bring services to the underserved in the Estero Bay (Los Osos, Morro Bay, Cayucos). We continue to work with at least 30 other organizations to complete the culture of care for all who need help. This year has brought changes in our board of directors, program coordinators and outreach. These changes bring new ideas and goals. I have embraced my role as Executive Director by being the rock that holds all the programs together. Fortunately, the program coordinators are dynamic, and the volunteer teams are both dedicated and believe in what they do. Our goal is to help those in need in whichever way we can.

The word to describe this time is organized. All the programs went through organizational changes. Areas of need where LOC has been able to assist (as of November 2022)



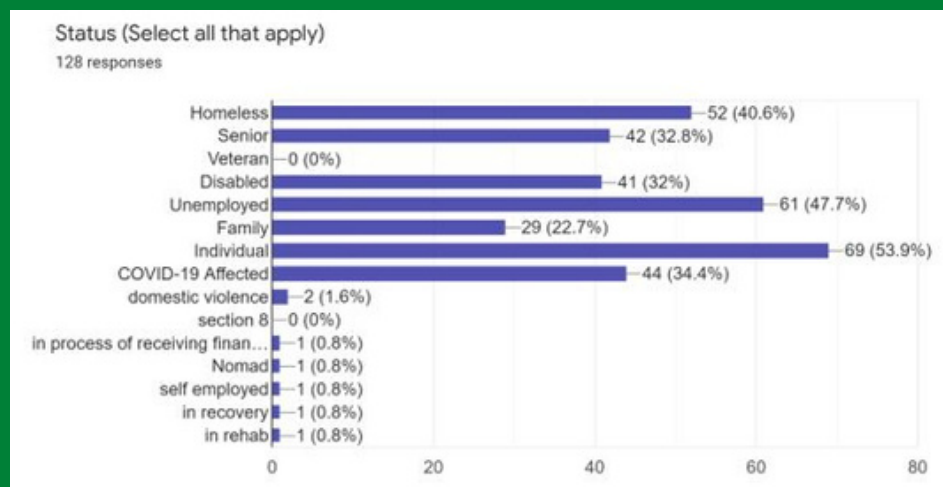

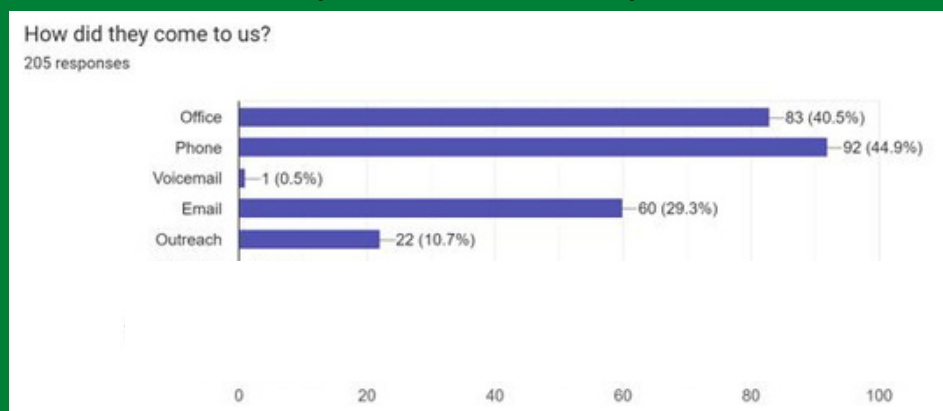
We have begun an **Estero Bay Youth Coalition** to help the communities work together on activities and updates to educational support. At this time we are establishing a resource List for all organizations who participate with youth outreach in the Estero Bay.

A coalition for **Latino Outreach** has begun to help those who are underserved and often do not know about services available for health, basic needs and education. We are working with community leaders, organizations and the Cuesta College Monarch Program. This year we worked with Undocu Support for a focus group in Los Osos and the Latino Health Coalition organizing a Latino Health Fair in Morro Bay.

Status of those LOC has been able to assist (as of November 2022)



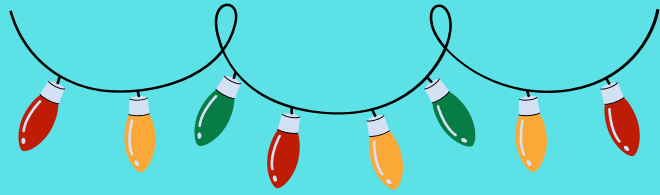
How People Reached Us (as of November 2022)

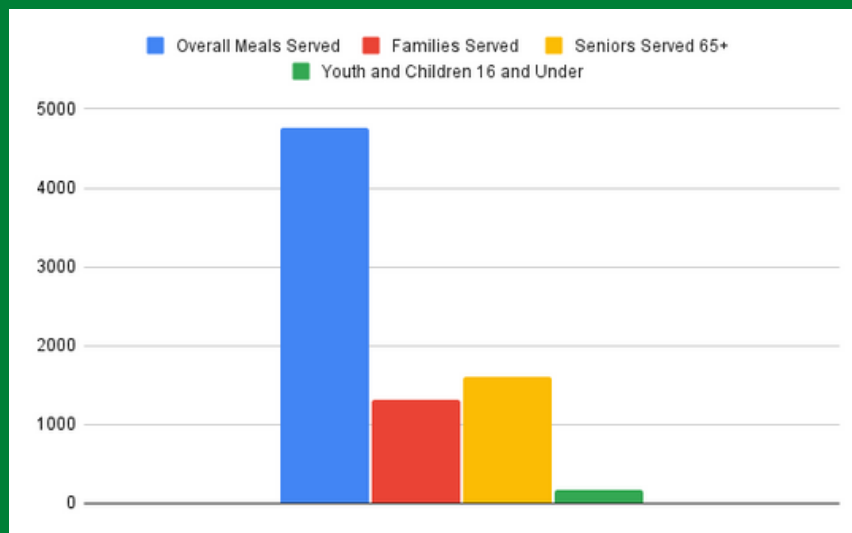


Our partners St Benedict's Episcopal Church and MB Lions are sponsoring Laundry Love in Los Osos and Morro Bay. These programs provide funds and detergents for free laundry twice monthly (the Third Wednesday of the month in Morro Bay and last Wednesday of the month in Los Osos). The cost of Laundry is high and this gives people a chance to feel the dignity of having clean clothes while saving a considerable amount of funds that can be used for other basic needs.



COMMUNITY DINNERS

**YTD Community Dinner Stats
(as of November 2022)**



The free community dinner has a volunteer core team of 15 plus 9 organizations and churches who prepare hot meals, rotating every month, for 100 people a week (the majority are seniors). With the rising cost of food we are asking for donations of non-perishable items such as: pasta, pasta sauce, beans, rice, 6-7 lb cans of vegetarian and beef chili. We also need items such as: blocks of cheese, butter, meat (chicken, ground beef, and turkey).

We try to support each serving team with supplies, aluminum pans and foil. Protein, fruit, dessert, eggs and so much more are sourced from many places. Always working to keep the cost at a minimum for LOC and our serving teams. It would be nice to see at least 1 or 2 new teams to help keep the dinners going. Some teams move on, or have new programs to support. There is our core group of weekly regulars that will work with any new team to help get them started. This way the job of providing meals is every other month.



Customers coming through the line are connected or educated about the programs available through outreach and county service providers.

The cost of to-go containers is one concern. We use at least 100-125 each week. At times we are able to hand out food from Fresh Rescue, (sell by date or it's fresh produce with a short shelf life.)

In October, the Community Dinner was moved to Wednesdays. The goal of all of the volunteers is to continue providing a meal, in the same place, at the same time. Consistency is what our customers depend upon.

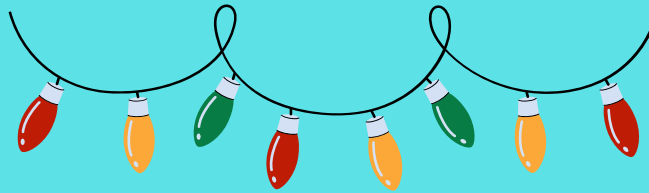
The dinners are a vital part of the Los Osos Cares Programs. People have depended on us for the past 5 years! We have developed friendships and have given many the socialization they need.

Estero Bay RU Ok & Senior Outreach

That’s how the conversation started. It’s a conversation becoming all too common. Part of it because our residents are becoming familiar with the ways that we can help them have a better life. Our seniors deserve that, and we are proud to be part of the solution. Before I go on, I want to acknowledge some very important people who have been busy behind the scenes making our program grow.



The senior program ROUK is in each area of the Estero Bay with phone lines directed to LO, Cayucos and Morro Bay They go beyond phone calls. On Thanksgiving Day 40 turkey pies were given to the homeless in Cayucos and Morro Bay (made by our volunteers Robyn, Alicia and Walt). and 3 turkeys delivered to needy families. Also every week food is taken to the Cayucos Senior Center, homebound seniors and farmworkers by our volunteer Walt. Our MB volunteer Sharon, takes food to the senior living apartments and homebound seniors. She is also doing outreach in the mobile home parks. She is very active doing outreach at food distribution sites and MB community dinner. Our Los Osos volunteers, led by Violeta Vallin, have expanded their outreach to the Mobile home parks and are working one on one with seniors who need services and help.

Walt Ramage, a Cayucos volunteer, makes food deliveries, along with other needed items, to those in need. He has made almost 80 deliveries so far this year.

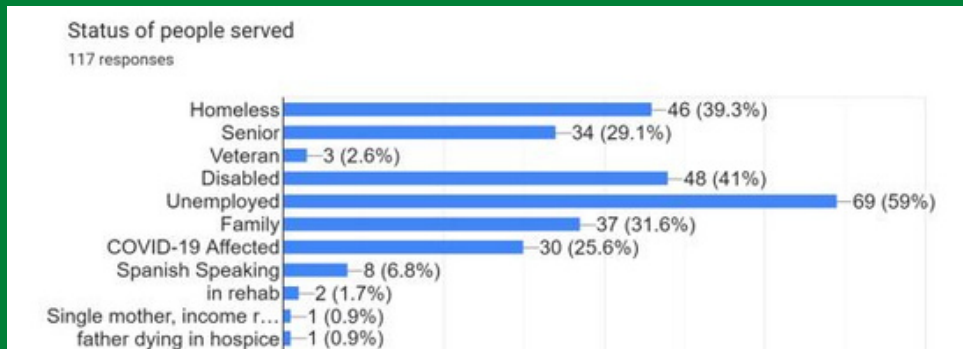


Womenade Estero Bay
